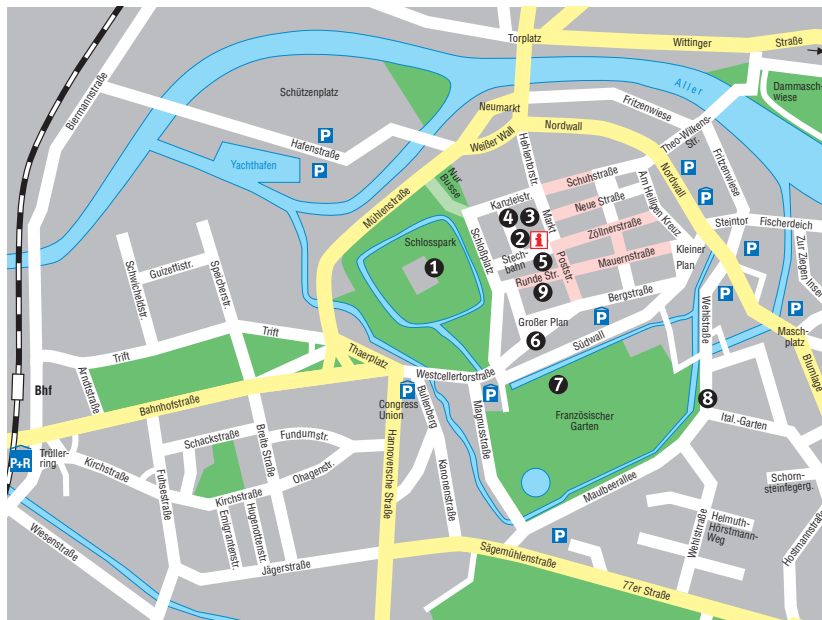

With over 490 faithfully restored half-timbered houses, the "Half-Timbered Jewel on the Aller" has more of these historical houses than anywhere else in Europe and is among the most beautiful half-timbered residential cities in Germany. The picturesque Guelph Palace and the modern 24-Hour Art

Museum right next to the awe-inspiring Bomann Museum in the old town are just some of the highlights that shouldn't be missed on a visit to Celle. Celle is also an important part of German architectural history and can comfortably compete with Weimar and Dessau when it comes to Bauhaus architecture.
