



Braunschweig

The Lion City boasts a rich history, lively cultural scene and pretty city centre. Many historical buildings and squares pay tribute to Braunschweig's important role as a Hanseatic city and royal residence. There is a wide range of retail outlets, eateries, theatres and cultural institutions. Large parks and the River Oker enrich the Lion City with plenty of leisure options. Lots of different guided tours, by land or by water, offer visitors a comprehensive impression of Braunschweig.

Events

■ Castle Square Open Air | Summer Music enjoyment will be staged in a unique historic setting, surrounded by the Cathedral St. Blasii and Dankwarderode Castle. Each summer the State Theatre Braunschweig shows an Open Air performance in the arena around the Castle Lion.

■ ATP Challenger Tennis Tournament "BraWo Open" | Summer

Top-class talents fight for points for the world rankings at the ATP Challenger Tennis Tournament "BraWo Open" in Braunschweig. In addition to exciting matches on the tennis courts, tournament guests can look forward to an extensive evening programme with a wide range of culinary delights.

■ Braunschweig International Film Festival | November

Every year the visitors gather to be swept off their feet, to worlds unknown. The focus is on young European cinema, always at a high level and with promising artists.

■ Braunschweiger Christmas Market End of November – End of December The Christmas Market has a tradition of more than 500 years. Numerous artisans and market traders invite to stroll and enjoy in the atmospheric historical surrounding around the St. Blasii

Attractions

Castle Square

The ancient history of the Lion City is palpable in the Burgplatz with St Blasii cathedral and Dankwarderode castle. Braunschweig's emblem sits enthroned in the centre of the square: the castle lion. The Guelph Duke Heinrich der Löwe (Henry the Lion) erected it in 1166 as a symbol of his power.

■ The River Oker

Surrounded by spacious parks, the River Oker flows around Braunschweig's city centre. Visitors can explore the city from the water and relax in nature on a leisurely barge trip or a more sporty canoe tour.

■ The Palace

The Quadriga visitors' platform at the castle offers guests an extraordinary view over Braunschweig. The main façade and much of the Palace visitors see today is a reconstruction. Over 600 original elements were reused in the reconstruction, many of which visitors can spot in the façade.

Pretty town centre

Lots of attractions in modern and historical buildings: that's what sets Braunschweig city centre apart. A mix of independent specialist shops, renowned chain stores, restaurants and cafés makes it the perfect place for a shopping trip.

Town Hall

161 steps lead up to the 61 metre high Town Hall Tower, offering visitors a beautiful view over the city centre and St Blasii cathedral.

■ Theatre scene

Braunschweig's vibrant theatre scene awaits visitors with plenty of music, dance and drama attractions: From top-class productions at the Staatstheater Braunschweig to diverse performances at the Komödie am Altstadtmarkt, Lower Saxony's largest private boulevard and entertainment theater, all the way to the relaxed living room atmosphere at KULT.

Magni district

The quaint Magni district is one of Braunschweig's oldest quarters. Lots of half-timbered houses are home to cosy cafés and boutiques, beckoning visitors to amble through the winding alleys. The famous Happy RIZZI House, with its bright popart façade by New York artist James Rizzi, offers a stark contrast to the historical architecture.

Museums

The Braunschweig museum landscape offers a diverse range of cultural gems from old masters and key works of art history to modern photography. With works by Rembrandt, Rubens and Vermeer, the Herzog Anton Ulrich-Museum houses an outstanding collection. The extensive art and cultural history collection of the Municipal Museum (Städtisches Museum) is just as impressive. At the various sites of the State Museum of Braunschweig (Braunschweigisches Landesmuseum) visitors can discover interesting details about the Lion City, past and present. The Kunstverein Braunschweig and the Museum for Photography (Museum für Photographie) showcase contemporary art. The Palace Museum offers insight into life at the Braunschweig court with original furniture and paintings. Many other museums and galleries add to the diverse range.

Excursions

■ Riddagshausen Monastery

In the east of Braunschweig lies the district of Riddagshausen. With the monastery church of St. Mariae, the free accessible monastery garden and a pond landscape that has been declared a nature conservation area the work of the Cistercian monks is still visible today.

■ Richmond Palace

The late baroque Palace with an English landscape garden lies in the south of Brunswick. It was built in the 18th century and its park is one of the oldest English landscape gardens in continental Europe.

Tip: Braunschweig, Goslar and the Autostadt are located very close to Wolfenbüttel.

City tours

• Walking tour through the Lion City Visitors can experience Braunschweig's tumultuous history and follow in the footsteps of the Hanseatic merchants and Guelphs on a relaxed stroll. Duration: 1,5 hours

■ Braunschweig – Hanseatic city on the River Oker

A journey through the Middle Ages: learn more about the significance of Braunschweig as a Hanseatic city and major trade centre. Duration: 1,5 hours

■ Sight-seeing tour on the vintage bus Journey through the history of the Lion City on a nostalgic vintage bus by Braunschweig-based firm Büssing. Duration: 1,5 hours

Richmond Palace

Visitors catch a glimpse of the magnificent grounds of Richmond Palace and enjoy the impressive English-style landscape garden. Duration: 1 hour

■ View from the Town Hall Tower To see Braunschweig from the Town Hall Tower, guests must climb 161 steps—

there is no elevator. During the Advent season, the view of the Christmas market is particularly impressive. Duration: 1 hour.

Visitors can explore Braunschweig from the water on a leisurely punt or barge trip. Duration 1.5 hours

Celle

With the biggest unified collection of half-timbered houses in Europe, a picturesque Guelph Palace with the Palace Theatre as well as various classical and modern museums, Celle is without doubt the highlight of any trip to Lüneburg Heath.

Celle also surprises visitors with its Bauhaus architecture and light art as well as being a great place to shop thanks to its variety of shops, restaurants and accommodation, making the compact town perfect for people of all ages.

Events

■ Northern Lights | End of February / Beginning March Fr – Sun Light festival around Celle Palace. Light art, music, acrobatics, culinary delights and great photo spots.

■ Celle Wine Market

Last weekend of July / Wednesday to Sunday

High-quality wines directly from the winegrower, culinary specialities and a different musical programme every day.

■ Fete at the Betz brewery

Mid August / Friday to Sunday Live music and Celle beer at the Carl Betz traditional brewery.

■ Vintage cars + half-timbered houses Last Sunday in August Every two years. Next event 2025. Over 1000 vintage cars come together in Celle Old Town.

■ Celle City Festival

Mid September / Friday to Saturday
The biggest festival in Celle with 3 stages
full of music and fun! Free entrance, open
air in the centre of the old town.

■ Celle Christmas market with winter magic | From the Monday before 1 Advent until after Christmas
Beautifully illuminated old town, Christmas pyramids, trombone choirs, lovingly decorated stalls with handcrafts and seasonal cuisine.

Attractions

Old town

Over 450 half-timbered houses form the centre of Celle's old town. A fully pedestrianised zone allows relaxed strolling and shopping in a historic setting

■ Celle Palace

The palace is located immediately adjacent to the old town. It's the former residence of Europe's oldest noble family, the Guelphs. The palace's famous chapel is considered the most important example of Renaissance art in northern Germany. The palace's theatre is Germany's oldest Baroque theatre with a permanent cast.

• Town church with royal crypt and steeple blower

Unmissable sights in the over 700-year-old building include the altar from 1613, the funerary monuments of the Guelph dukes (16th/17th century) in the chancel, the gallery pictures (17th century) and the 1687 Baroque organ, which was restored in 1999 according to the original plans. A tour of the church, an ascent up the steeple and a visit to the royal crypt round out the attractions

■ Lower Saxon State Stud farm
Established in 1735, the stud lies in the heart of Celle, not far from the old town.
The centrepiece of the stud farm is the parade ground. Every year in late summer there is a stallion show followed by a summer fun event.

■ Celle's gardens

Relax and unwind in the palace grounds, the French garden or even the apiary: Celle's gardens are a key part of its royal history. The physic garden captivates and educates visitors with its aromatic and scented beds.

Bauhaus architecture

There is a surprising number of Bauhaus buildings which can still be seen in Celle. They remain a firm part of the cityscape, even 100 years after the buildings and settlements were constructed

Museums

■ Residence Museum at Celle Palace The history of the palace and its residents are brought back to life at the palace museum.

■ Bomann-Museum

The Bomann Museum was established in 1892 and is dedicated to rural and urban cultural history.

■ Art museum with Robert Simon collection

The world's first 24/7 art museum (light

Synagogue

Built around 1740. Oldest preserved Jewish place of worship in Lower Saxony.

Excursions

■ Wienhausen Convent

Established in the 13th century, this impressive convent building is home to many interesting artefacts including famous tapestries and a collection of historical spectacles.

Winser Museum Farm

The region's agricultural history from the 17th-19th centuries is brought to life here. Buildings grouped around the farmstead include the coach house, a traditional German granary with its appealing design, the bakehouse, hay barn and pigsty. A well, apiary and a small garden with plants for making dyes and kitchen herbs complete the grounds.

Lüneburg Heath

The Lüneburg Heath Nature Park, with a unique natural and cultural landscape, activities and theme parks, starts right at the city gates.

Einbeck CK

Discover a charming little town in southern Niedersachsen, where a unique blend of intricate half-timbered architecture, a passion for classic cars, a distinctive beer culture and pictur-esque landscapes invite you to explore on foot or by bike. Adding to its appeal are traditional crafts such as the local blueprint textile printing, a speciality mustard manufactory and a vi-brant street art scene.

The many facets of this wonderful town come together to create a colourful adventure that delights all the senses - there's so much to experience and enjoy.

Events

- The Einbecker Hoffest festival at the end of April has become a legendary celebration which is renowned well beyond the town's borders, hosted by the brewery Einbecker Brauhaus AG. With the ceremonial tapping of the special Mai-Ur-Bock beer, live music and guided brewery tours, this event promises a fantastic experience.
- At the Einbeck Beer Town Run (Einbecker BierstadtLauf) in May, you can take part in a unique running event set against the charming backdrop of the historical town centre, with a choice of different race distances.
- The Einbeck Classic Car Days (Einbecker Oldtimertage) in July are undoubtedly a yearly highlight. Alongside a vibrant programme of events, the popular PS.SPEICHER Rallye attracts classic car enthusiasts and their vehicles to Einbeck. The PS.Halle, the museum's dedicated event venue, also hosts readings, concerts and cultural events throughout the year, including the Cultural Power Days (KUL-TURKRAFTTAGE) in March, which offers a diverse programme.
- Join us for the Einbecker Eulenfest on the second weekend in October: With live music covering almost every genre across multiple stages, over 200 market stalls and a variety of fairground rides, there's something for everyone to enjoy.
- In late summer, artists from around the world come to Einbeck to create new works for the Einbeck Street Art Mile, giving you the chance to watch them in action and see their creativity unfold up close. A lively supporting programme features live music, fun activities for children and guided street art tours.

■ In December, the Einbeck Christmas Village (Einbecker Weihnachtsdorf) fills the town centre with a festive atmosphere. Twinkling lights, the scent of candied almonds and the sound of children's laughter create a magical scene in the market square.

Attractions

■ Classic car romance

The PS.SPEICHER invites visitors on a journey through time all year round, offering far more than just a treat for classic car enthusiasts. Here, the past comes to life in a truly special and entertaining way – it's a real petrolhead's time machine worthy of Doc Brown and Marty McFly. Housed in a lovingly restored 18th-century granary, the classic cars take you back to another era. Historical documents, photographs and interactive exhibits bring the exhibition to life, promising an unforgettable experience. Changing special exhibitions ensure there's always something new to discover.

■ Half-timbered charm amid a historic backdrop

Einbeck is a hidden gem for admirers of half-timbered architecture. Strolling through the historical town centre is like walking past life-sized dollhouses, each with its own story to tell - tales of the lives of their inhabitants and the fires that once swept through Einbeck. The elaborate façades will set your imagination racing and provide a picturesque setting to relax in one of the town's many charming cafés and restaurants.

■ Einbeck's brewing tradition

What would Einbeck be without its legendary beer? Brewing has been a way of life here since the 14th century. Every sip of Einbecker beer is a testament to craftsmanship, passion and tradition. A guided tour offers fascinating insights into the origins of the Bockbier and the art of brewing. And the best part? A tasting is included - cheers to Einbeck!

■ The art of blue printing

Traditional blue printing has long been a part of Einbeck's heritage. In a charming shop, visitors can browse a range of beautiful accessories made from these heritage fabrics. The local workshop offers the chance to watch artisans at work on selected dates and if you're keen to get hands-on, workshops provide the perfect opportunity to try the craft for yourself.

■ Street art in Einbeck

Einbeck is an open-air gallery bursting with colourful murals and creative graffiti. These vibrant artworks bring a fresh, dynamic energy to the town, turning every stroll into a journey of discovery. Don't forget your camera - Instagram will thank you! With new works added each year, Einbeck's street art scene is a testament to the city's creativity and diversity.

€ xcursions

- Roman battlefield at Harzhorn
- The battlefield at Harzhorn is considered one of the best-preserved ancient battlefields in Europe. Visitors can still trace individual skirmishes, arrow volleys and the looting of supply wagons along the information trail. Guided tours with qualified experts are available. Workshops for both children and adults offer handson activities and the chance to explore history together. (Travel by car required.)
- Tree Rock: High ropes course and adventure golf

Experience the woodland atmosphere of the Weser Uplands with an exciting climbing adventure. Share the thrill together and encourage each other when things get a little shaky. Or, enjoy a relaxed round of (mini) golf on 18 courses, featuring a variety of fun and challenging obstacles. (Travel by car required.)

Museums

■ The Einbeck TownMuseum invites you to explore the 800-year history of this former Hanseatic town. It also offers fascinating insights into various traditional crafts and houses the RadHaus, an impressive bicycle museum. Cycling and mobility have played a key role in Einbeck's history since 1888, thanks to August Stukenbrok, a pioneering local bicycle manufacturer and mail-order entrepreneur. The passion and dedication to preserving these traditional crafts can be felt throughout, creating a truly unique atmosphere.

City tours Public guided tours

- Through the centuries: Every day at 14:30, with additional tours at 11:00 on weekends and public holidays (April to October). Expert guides share captivating stories from the town's 800-year history.
- Light beer and dark shadows: Experience Einbeck in a whole new light! On the first Friday of every month, all year round, join a unique evening tour taking in half-timbered houses, the Diek Tower and historic churches. To top it off, your guide will share fascinating stories about Einbeck's beer history over a freshly poured brew or a refreshing soft drink.
- Pedalling to success: The story of August Stukenbrok: On the third Saturday of each month at 11:00 (April-October), this guided tour delves into the life of August Stukenbrok, the 'first mail-order king' and includes a walk through the manufacturer's magnificent villa.
- Blue printing tour: Get a behind-thescenes look at the traditional art of blue printing! On the second Friday of each month at 14:30 (April-October), visit the workshop and even print your own fabric tote bag to take home.

Self-guided tours

- Crime trail: An outdoor escape game meets a (crime-themed) treasure hunt: equipped with a smartphone, a case file and an arrest warrant code, you'll investigate a fictional crime case while being guided past some of Einbeck's most iconic landmarks. Available at the Tourist Information Centre.
- Beer trail: The Einbeck Beer Trail (Einbecker Bierpfad) is a circular route of approxi-mately 2 km within the historic town ramparts. Follow the barrel trail through Einbeck at your own pace. The painted symbols will lead the way. Along the route, you'll find eight large metal barrels that are impossible to miss. Each one reveals a piece of the town's brewing history.



■ Parking for coaches

Göttingen

The university city of Göttingen is always worth a visit. Get ready for exceptional cultural events of international standing and special attractions. For example, have you heard of the new Forum Wissen (Forum of Knowledge), which presents the collections of Göttingen University? Or choose Göttingen as an adventure destination with its combination of urban discovery and the varied natural landscape of the Weserbergland hills and Harz mountains. Visitors are always drawn to Göttingen for its atmospheric cultural events such as the International Handel Festival, Göttingen literature festival or its traditional Christmas market. Find inspiration and offers here.

Events

■ International Handel Festival May

Germany's oldest Handel festival promises an outstanding musical experience. A highlight each year is the performance of one of Handel's operas.

■ Culture night | *June*

Culture vultures will be spoiled for choice with all the venues and stages in central Göttingen. Museums and galleries throw open their doors for night owls and the traditional open air concert by the Göttingen Symphonic Orchestra takes place in front of the Old Town Hall.

■ Göttingen Kultursommer July- September

Outstanding concerts, readings and festivals at unusual locations. The Open Air highlight held in Kaiser-Wilhelm-Park with international, national and local stars takes place each to years.

- Gänseliesel festival | End of September A town festival celebrating Göttingen's emblem: the Gänseliesel (little Goose girl). Featuring a vibrant programme throughout the city centre and a special Sunday opening of shops. A food-truck-mile and the crowning of 'Miss Gänseliesel' complete the day.
- Göttinger Literaturherbst (autumn literature festival | October
 The Göttingen Literaturherbst gets underway right after the Frankfurt Book Fair. Both world-renowned and up-and-coming authors read their favourite works a delight for lovers of national and international literature.

- Göttingen Jazzfestival | *November* The Göttingen Jazz Festival has been a fixture on the calendar of all jazz fans for 40 years. The festival celebrates all genres of jazz from Dixieland and swing to bebop.
- Christmas market | End of November to end of December

Over 70 festive wooden stalls in the heart of Göttingen's Old Town – around the Old Town Hall and the impressive Johanniskirche church – invite visitors to stroll around and soak up the atmosphere from the end of November to the end of December.

Attractions

Old Town Hall

The main structure of the Old Town Hall was built around 1270 and initially served as a market place and medieval shopping centre. Sights not to be missed include the handsome Gothic arch and the hall with its impressive mural paintings, as well as the medieval council chamber with its fully preserved Gothic heating system and jail.

■ Gänsliesel fountain

You'll find the city's emblem – the Goose Girl fountain – in the market square in front of the Old Town Hall. Following an old tradition, every graduating PhD student at Göttingen University kisses the little statue on the cheek and places flowers in her basket. That's why Gänseliesel is probably the 'most kissed girl in the world'!

• Wilhelmsplatz with university auditorium

One of the hubs of Göttingen University is right in the city centre. The neoclassical auditorium with the beautifully carved reliefs on its pediment is particularly

eye-catching. Inside is the large ballroom with its impressive portraits of rulers and the detention room, the university's old student prison. Both can be visited on a guided tour of the city.

Old Town

One of the particularly striking features of Göttingen is the thriving side streets in the old town. Half-timbered houses spanning several centuries line the streets and are home to little independent boutiques with goods and specialities from all over the world. You'll want to linger in the bars and restaurants in the enchanting courtyards in the Börner district.

■ City wall with Old Botanical Gardens
The promenade along the old city wall
encircling Göttingen's old town offers
spectacular views. The fortification was
built between 1362 and 1577. A highlight between the Deutsches Theater and
Auditorium is the Old Botanical Garden.
You can explore the gardens and historical
greenhouses on both sides of the walls.

Excursions

Ebergötzen

The Wilhelm-Busch mill is where the famous cartoonist and poet spent much of his school time, and was later the inspiration behind the Max and Moritz stories. Why not combine your visit with a detour to the European Bread Museum just opposite?

■ The country estate of Count Hardenberg

High above the country estate of Count Hardenberg sits the old castle ruin, which can be explored as part of a tour. At the bottom lies the castle hotel and Hardenberg Distillery, which is open for visits and tasting evenings.

■ Museum Friedland

The old Friedland railway building is home to a museum devoted to the history of the border crossing camp. From 1945 to today, the camp has documented the moving and chequered history of flight, forced displacement, migration and integration in Germany.



The museum landscape in Göttingen has seen welcome growth in recent years. In addition to the municipal museum, which focuses on urban history, the new museum of knowledge or 'Forum Wissen' opened in May 2022, showcasing exhibits from the collections of Göttingen University.

Goslar

Goslar combines tangible history and winding alleys lined with half-timbered houses in the old town with boundless green spaces in its proximity to the natural landscape of the Harz mountains, plus warm hospitality in its numerous shops, restaurants and cafés. Even UNESCO values the town's unique attractions: the old town with over 1500 half-timbered houses and the Imperial Palace as well as the former Rammelsberg ore mine became World Heritage Sites in 1992. In 2010 the Upper Harz Water Management System was added to the list, thus completing the trio of World Heritage Sites in Goslar. This can all be experienced in the World Heritage information centre in the historical town hall in the market square.

■ Walpurgis | 30 April Witches and devils are up to mischief on the Goslar market square and welcome the spring.

■ Garden market | *May* With something for everyone, garden lovers will find inspiration and tips for the new gardening season at the many stands from the region and plenty of opportunities to buy local – from plants and gardening tools to decorations and outdoor play equipment.

- Marksmen's Festival and Fun Fair | *July* 10 day of fun, action and adrenaline for people of every age, with exciting rides, festival hall, fireworks and much more.
- Artisan market | August

Attractions

Historical Town Hall

Goslar Town Hall was built between 1295 and 1326 and is one of the oldest preserved town halls in the German-speaking world. The medieval town hall with its assembly hall and meeting room has been renovated and extended many times. In the town's golden age in the 15th and 16th centuries, the building was modernised and extended in keeping with the time. Today, the vaulted cellar houses a World Heritage information centre and the ground floor is the Goslar tourist information office.

■ Goslar Old Town

With over 1,500 half-timbered houses, Goslar's old town has been listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1992. Many restaurants, cafés and shops attract visitors to linger in this special medieval setting.

■ Imperial Palace

The Imperial Palace was built between 1039 and 1042 and is a unique monument of world architecture. German history was written at imperial assemblies here for 200 years. The adjacent palace chapel of St Ulrich to the south contains the heart of Heinrich III, who died in 1056, under a gravestone with a figurative depiction of the emperor – 'because his heart was always in Goslar'.

Excursions

Wöltingerode monastery

The historical walls of the Wöltingerode monastery in the Goslar district of Vienenburg were built in 1174. Ever since the monastery distillery was established in 1682, the Wöltingerode monastery has been famous for its refined spirits, which can be sampled on a guided tour. Close by is Lake Vienenburg, a wonderful spot to relax.

■ ErlebnisBocksBerg Hahnenklee

The ErlebnisBocksBerg adventure resort in Hahnenklee offers plenty to do all year round, from the 1250-metre-long summer toboggan run known as BocksBerg Bob, to a bike park, Bocksberg carts and much more.

■ Rammelsberg World Heritage Site

The Rammelsberg ore mine has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1992 and was in operation for more than 1000 years. Today there is a museum and visitor mine.

■ Hahnenklee stave church & Liebesbankweg trail

The stave church built in Goslar-Hahnenklee in 1907-1908 was modelled on Norwegian stave churches and is shaped like a Viking ship. Alongside the stave church you'll find the Liebesbankweg – a trail featuring 25 individually designed wooden benches, each representing a relationship hallmark or wedding anniversary, from first getting to know each other through to the diamond anniversary.

Museums

- The Rammelsberg World Heritage Site with its museum & show mine gives an authentic insight into the past life of miners.
- The Imperial Palace, built between 1040 and 1050, was a magnificent residence of the medieval monarchy and is now a museum.
- The Mönchehaus Museum has a permanent collection of contemporary and modern art and awards Goslar's internationally renowned Kaiserring Art Prize.
- The museum bank is home to the cultural market place with Goslar Museum and the pewter figure museum depicting Goslar's history through permanent and special exhibitions.
- The Goslar Zwinger bailey was part of the fortifications of the old imperial city and brings the Middle Ages to life in a museum which can be visited by groups by prior arrangement.

■ Pied Piper's house (Rattenfängerhaus) The Pied Piper's house gets its name from the inscription on the children's exodus on the side of the house in Bungelosenstraße. The house, which was built in 1602-1603, features all of the stylistic elements of Weser Renaissance architecture.

■ Pied Piper puppet show and carillon Every day at 13:05, 15:35 and 17:35, the Pied Piper does his rounds at the west gable of the Hochzeithaus. Earlier, at 9:35 the chimes play the Pied Piper tune and the Weser tune at 11:35.

■ Hameln's Pied Piper trail

Over 300 rat symbols cast in bronze show visitors to the old town the way to the main sights. More information can be found on the information boards.

■ Leist- and Stiftsherrenhaus

The Stiftsherrenhaus (built 1558) features rich ornamental and figurative decorations in three zones. The Leisthaus (built 1585-1589) boasts a richly adorned façade. Together these impressive buildings from the Weser Renaissance house the Hameln Museum.

■ View from Klüt

Hameln's local mountain, Klüt, towering approximately 200 metres above the River Weser, offers a legendary view of the Pied Piper's town.

Hochzeitshaus

The 43-metre-long sandstone building in the centre of the old town was built in 1610-1617 as a festival hall for citizens. It was the last building built in the Weser Renaissance style in Hameln

Excursions

By boat

The beautiful landscape of Weserbergland is best enjoyed on a trip on the Flotte Weser. Tours and a scheduled service operate from Hameln between April and October.

Hämelschenburg Castle

Ten kilometres south of Hameln, the impressive moated castle and its grounds, the estate buildings, the mill and the church form one of Germany's most beautiful Renaissance ensembles.

■ Weser cycle path

The Weser cycle path from Hannoversch Münden through Hameln to the North Sea offers cyclists a diverse holiday landscape. Members of the German Cycling Association have repeatedly voted it Germany's favourite cycle path.

Museums

■ Hameln Museum

The Hameln Museum is in the heart of the old town, and arguably occupies the most beautiful buildings. The history of the town of Hameln is presented across 1200 m₂. A whole section is dedicated to the Pied Piper legend.

Museums in Hefehof

Precious rarities can be found a mere 200 metres south of the train station. The Automuseum presents unique, roadworthy vintage cars, which were produced over 110 years ago in Hameln. Right next to the Automuseum is a museum devoted to the history of printing, which has historical presses on display.

■ UNESCO World Heritage Site
In 1985 UNESCO added St Michael's
Church and St Mary's Cathedral with all its
precious bronze castings to its World Heritage list. St Michaelis Church is considered
one of the most beautiful early Romanesque churches in Europe. St Mary's Cathedral too is an impressive sight, not least
because of its vast proportions and unique artistic treasures.

■ Historical market square

The market square, which was faithfully reconstructed in the 1980s, today combines history with modernity. In addition to the Town Hall and Tempelhaus, the Knochenhauer Guild Hall – one of the most beautiful half-timbered houses in the world – can also be seen here.

■ St Andreas' church tower

At 114.5 metres, Lower Saxony's tallest steeple towers over the rooftops of the town. 364 steps lead up the steeple, past the bell tower and the old clock, to a two-storey platform at 75 metres, which offers a 360° panoramic view of Hildesheim and the region.

Half-timbered quarter

Stroll through the historical streets in the half-timbered quarter which survived the war, where the simple craftspeople once lived. Today these quiet residential streets feature picture-perfect, half-timbered houses in different styles. Other highlights in the half-timbered quarter include St Godehard's basilica and the Kehrwiederwall with the last preserved fortified tower – the Kehrwiederturm.

■ 1000-year-old rose bush The legend of the 1000-year-old rose bush on the cathedral apse dates back to the founding history of the diocese of Hildes-

on the cathedral apse dates back to the founding history of the diocese of Hildesheim. Every year the blossom can be admired for a few weeks at the end of May.

■ The Rose Route

White ceramic stones with a decorative rose motif in the pavements point the way to the highlights of the town. A pocket brochure with a map and further information is also available from Tourist Information.

■ Fagus Factory: A UNESCO World Heritage Site

In 2011, the living Fagus Factory monument in Alfeld was the first industrial building of the modern era to be awarded UNESCO World Heritage status. The Fagus Factory has produced shoe lasts for over 100 years. Interactive guided tours of the factory provide a glimpse behind the scenes.

Between stops, your guide will share interesting facts and entertaining anecdotes about the city and its history.

■ Wolfenbütteler weekly market Every Wednesday and Saturday The vibrant weekly market with many regional products, which is popular with locals and tourists alike, is held twice a week in the heart of the old town in the historical square from 7:00 to 13:00.

■ Festivals in Wolfenbüttel | *Summer*Be it the May festival, Old Town Festival or Stadtgrabenfest – the three major festivals take place each year between May and September in the town of the famous 18th-century philsopher and dramatist Gotthold Ephraim Lessing.

• KulturSommer Wolfenbüttel July /August

Wolfenbüttel's number one open-air festival showcases national and international artists from all cultural sectors every year in front of the Lessing Theatre.

■ Wolfenbüttel Christmas market

November / December
With over 40 Christmas stalls, unique half-timbered booths, the historical atmosphere and enchanting courtyards, the Wolfenbüttel Christmas market has been unrivalled since 1585.

Attractions

Old town

With over 1000 half-timbered houses and court officials' offices as well as the world's first Protestant church building (Beatae Mariae Virginis) with Guelph grave and the Baroque St Trinity Church, the old town is a treasure trove among Germany's historical towns.

Lessing House

Nowhere in Wolfenbüttel will you get closer to the important Enlightenment philospher and dramatist Gotthold Ephraim Lessing than in the Lessing house, not far from Duke August's Library, where the poet and thinker earned his living as the librarian.

■ Main Church with Guelph Crypt
The main church Beatae Mariae Virginis
is the world's first large Protestant church
building, blending Gothic, Renaissance,
and Baroque elements into a magnificent
structure. Deep beneath the church, members of the Guelph family rest in elaborately
decorated sarcophagi. The crypt is open to
visitors.

■ Memorials in the JVA

A new documentation centre in the grounds of the correctional facility (JVA) in Wolfenbüttel is devoted to justice and punishment during National Socialism and the early Federal Republic of Germany. The documation centre hosts a permanent exhibition entitled: "Justice.Crime. Consequences. Prison in Wolfenbüttel under National Socialism."

■ Old fortifications and the River Oker During the Renaissance, Wolfenbüttel was one of the biggest fortifications in the north. A model in the Bürger Museum illuminates the history of these fascinating constructions. Of course, these days the fortifications are no longer in use and are now a green belt around the city. And don't miss the River Oker, where you can canoe, paddle board and take a barge trip

Excursions

UNESCO Global Geopark

The UNESCO geopark spans the Harz, Braunschweiger Land and Ostfalen regions. Here you will learn lots of interesting information at different stations about humankind's oldest hunting weapons, forest elephants and where the region was once a seabed.

■ Till Eulenspiegel Museum Schöppenstedt

Till Eulenspiegel, the picaresque hero of medieval German folklore, was born in Kneitlingen, not far from Wolfenbüttel. It was from here he went out to play his merry pranks on people and to hold up a mirror up to them to expose everyday foolishness.

Werla Imperial Palace

One of the German emperors' oldest palaces can be found south of Wolfenbüttel. Explore the vestiges of bygone days in the landscaped park and marvel at the reconstruction of the long-lost imperial palace.

■ Tip: Braunschweig, Goslar and the Autostadt are located very close to Wolfenbüttel.

Museums

■ Wolfenbüttel Palace

For centuries Wolfenbüttel was the royal seat of the Guelphs and one of the cultural centres of northern Germany. In the heart of the city lies Wolfenbüttel Palace, which evolved from a medieval moated castle. Not only is Wolfenbüttel Palace the second biggest of its kind in northern Germany, it is also home to the High Baroque state apartments of the old state of Braunschweig – the only such state apartments to be preserved in their original condition.

■ Bürger Museum (Citizen's Museum)
Do you know the connection between
Wolfenbüttel and basketball, or that our
city once trained world-class pastry chefs?
Discover this and much more in the
Bürger Museum, where 500 years of town
history are engagingly brought to life. In
the old Jahn gym, visitors can learn facts
and long and short stories about the life
of citizens in the town of the important
Enlightenment thinker Gotthold Ephraim
Lessing in the permanent exhibition.
